NSC Foundation Scholarships

The Nevada State College Foundation funds a number of scholarship programs for students. Applications are reviewed by NSC committees which include faculty from across campus. Award amounts are determined by the Foundation based on donor agreements. The application for the upcoming school year is available from December 15 through April 15 at nsc.edu/finaid.

Matching Scholarship

NSC will provide a match of up to \$500 per semester to students who receive a scholarship from an outside agency (excludes any scholarships awarded by NSC, NSHE or the State of Nevada).

The match will be automatically applied during the semester to degree-seeking students with a minimum 2.75 cumulative NSC GPA who are making Satisfactory Academic Progress, and who are enrolled full-time (12 or more credits). This scholarship is available to new and continuing students.

Scholarships for New Students

In order to be considered for the following scholarships, a student must meet the priority deadline for admissions as follows:

- 1. To meet the priority deadline for admission, a student must submit their application and \$30 application fee by 11:59 PM Pacific Time on Wednesday, April 15, 2015.
- 2. A student's complete application, which includes all of the supporting documents, must be received by Nevada State College no later than Friday, June 1, 2015.

Scorpion Scholars Merit Scholarship Program

At the time of admission, new students will be evaluated for eligibility to be named as a Nevada State College Scorpion Scholar. Eligible students must graduate from high school with a minimum 3.25 unweighted GPA, or from a community college within the Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE) with a 3.25 GPA and an AA, AS, AB, or AAS in Nursing. Students must enroll as a full-time (12 or more credits), degree-seeking student at NSC the semester immediately following graduation. Freshman recipients may qualify to receive an award during the first eight fall or spring semesters of their enrollment, and transfer students during the first four. Students will be placed in one of three award levels based on their entering GPA as follows.

Award Level	GPA Criteria	Maximum Award
Presidential	3.75 and above	\$2,500 semester
Scorpion	3.5 - 3.74	\$1,500 semester
Black and Gold	3.25 - 3.49	\$500 semester

Scorpion Scholars must be enrolled full-time (12 or more credits) at NSC to receive the award during a semester and meet the minimum GPA requirement for their category. This is the cumulative GPA of all non-remedial courses taken at NSC that appears on the academic transcript and which will be reviewed prior to the beginning of each semester. If a recipient's GPA does not meet the minimum requirement for their award level, but satisfies the requirements for a lower tier level, the student will receive an incentive award for that semester equaling the highest lower-tier amount for which the GPA qualified. Students may not receive an award from a tier higher than their initial award level. Students placed on Satisfactory Academic Progress suspension or probation are ineligible to receive an award until the student regains good standing. NSC will confirm enrollment after the end of each semester's add/drop period, and reverse any disbursements for which a student is no longer eligible based on decreased enrollment. In the event recipients do not meet the enrollment or GPA requirement for any award in a semester, they may regain eligibility in the next fall or spring semester, until the award expires.

Transfer Scholarship

NSC will award a one-time \$1,000 scholarship to students transferring from a NSHE community college with an AA, AB, or AS degree, a minimum 2.75 GPA and who are not awarded under the Scorpion Scholars Merit Scholarship Program. Students must enroll as a full-time (12 or more credits), degree-seeking student to receive the award.

Leadership Scholarship

NSC will award a one-time \$1,000 scholarship to students in their first semester of enrollment who held an officer position in their high school student government, entering with a 2.75 unweighted cumulative high school GPA and who enroll as a full-time (12 or more credits), degree-seeking student. Students should notify NSC of their eligibility at the time of application to the College.


